



<p>18 immigration</p>  <p>the process of entering one country to take up permanent or semi-permanent residence</p> <p>Example: Immigration results in population growth in a country.</p> <p>(SS060305)</p>	<p>19 emigration</p>  <p>the process of leaving one country to take up permanent or semi-permanent residence</p> <p>Example: Emigration results in population loss in a country.</p> <p>(SS060305)</p>
<p>20 net migration</p> <p>the net effect of immigration and emigration on an area's population in a given time period</p> <p>Example: Net migration is expressed as an increase or a decrease.</p> <p>(SS060305)</p>	<p>21 push factors</p>  <p>factors that push people out of one place to another place</p> <p>Example: Conflict and a lack of jobs serve as push factors.</p> <p>(SS060305)</p>
<p>22 pull factors</p>  <p>factors that pull, or attract, people to move to a place</p> <p>Example: Jobs and a higher standard of living serve as pull factors.</p> <p>(SS060305)</p>	<p>23 refugee</p>  <p>a person who has been forced to leave his/her country in order to escape war, persecution or natural disaster</p> <p>Example: Refugees often have to flee their country with few of their belongings.</p> <p>(SS060305)</p>
